



The Transport Museums Challenge 2024

Or *TRAINS, BOATS, PLANES, CARS AND BIKES*

RULES

THE AIM OF THE CHALLENGE IS TO VISIT AND, IF YOU WISH, TOUR AS MANY REGIONAL TRANSPORT MUSEUMS AS YOU CAN

These Museums range from national collections down to small niche collections, which may only open limited hours.

Points will be awarded for each museum visited on your bike.

It is not a requirement that you actually enter and tour the museum.

Bonus points will be awarded for visiting all 41 of the closest museums, less than 150 miles away.

The points are awarded on miles "as the crow flies" from Needham Market Community Centre. These miles are only used for the purpose of creating the scoring system and are not an indication of the routes you would use nor the distance travelled to get to the venue.

Destinations in Kent are calculated via the Dartford crossing.

Most points at the end of The Challenge wins.

In the event of a tie on points, the person who visited the most museums will win.

You can claim each museum only once.

If entrants are still tied, then the prize pot will be divided equally between the winners.

There is **no** requirement to submit photos as you go.

At the end of the Challenge, all entrants must submit details of their total points and museum visits.

Those entrants with the highest scores will be asked to send in all their photographs, **one** per museum, as proof of their visits.

If you are using photographs of just your bike, then the same bike should be used in every picture. If you use a variety of bikes, we would expect to see the same bike in more than one picture.

The last date for any visit is 31st October 2024.

You must submit your total visits and points within a week of the closing date.

The Challenge is open to all members of Suffolk Riders - Life, Full or Associate.

The prizes will be presented at our December Group meeting.

Please use common sense during the Challenge and do not take any risks in obtaining your photos.
